

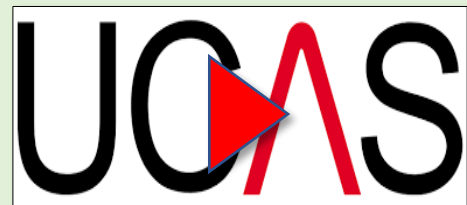
MAKING APPLICATIONS - Clearing and Clearing-plus factsheet

Clearing is the process of matching applicants to university places that are yet to be filled. Clearing is available to those of you who have made a UCAS application but don't hold any offers.

This year we are also introduced to a new system called 'Clearing Plus' but before we jump ahead, let's focus on initial, normal, friendly clearing.

UCAS state that, running from 5th July to mid-September, you'll be eligible for Clearing if:

- ☑ You apply after 30th of June
- ☑ You are not holding any offers from universities or colleges you're applied to.
- ☑ Your place is not confirmed after exam results are published.

Why might you apply for Clearing?

Clearing can be a life line if you don't get the A-Level results you were looking for or If you don't get any offers from your chosen universities.

But more than that, if you change your mind about **what** you want to study or even **where** you want to study it!



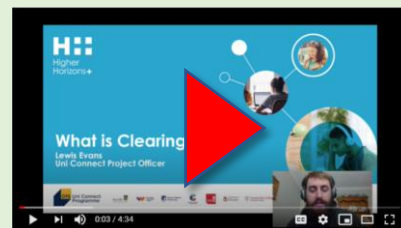
Clearing Plus

By early July 2020 there will be a new system in place called 'Clearing Plus' which in no way replaces traditional clearing!

It will work through an algorithm, and similarly to Clearing itself, only UCAS will match unplaced potential undergraduates with vacancies relevant to them!

UCAS state that, running from 5th July to mid-September, you'll be eligible for clearing if:

- You apply after 30th of June
- You are not holding any offers from universities or colleges you're applied to.
- Your place is not confirmed after exam results are published.
