1. Health and Life Sciences:
The Health and Life Science sector employs over 110,000 people throughout the Liverpool City Region, with Liverpool being home to more specialist hospitals and health centres than any other UK city outside of London.

2. Maritime and Logistics:
Liverpool2 is a £400 million investment to create a deep-water container terminal that will enable the largest vessels to call at the port.

3. Advanced Manufacturing:
*With an ageing workforce, it is estimated that over **30,000 employees** will need to be replaced in manufacturing occupations over the next decade.*

4. Construction and Built Environment:
Construction has the highest take up of apprenticeships out of all sectors and has contributed over £25 billion GVA to the Liverpool City Region economy in the last 20 years.

5. Digital Sector:
The Liverpool City Region benefits from a number of unique digital assets, including the GTT Express transatlantic internet cable, and the STFC Hartree Centre at SciTech Daresbury.

6. Green Growth:
The Green Growth economy is a continuous growth sector and is extremely important to the local economy, employing around 37,000 people across 4,500 enterprises

7. Visitor Economy: The Visitor Economy is a major driver of economic growth and prosperity in the Liverpool City Region and is worth more than £4.2bn a year to its economy, providing more than 50,000 jobs locally.
