What are growth sectors?

Labour Market Information can help us understand the job market. It tells us what qualifications are needed for a job, the salary, how popular that industry is, how many jobs are available and where - information that helps you decide on your pathway into your future career.

Areas that are currently popular are called Growth Sectors – they're areas where more jobs are becoming available, usually because there's more investment in these sectors. These sectors are expected to keep growing over the next few years, which means you can use this information to plan for your future.

Our region is made up of over 44,000 businesses which are grouped into growth sectors. Using growth sector information from the Be More website you can understand the sector, see how many jobs in this area are near you, explore career progression and find other key information like pathways in and employee experience in these careers.

Apprenticeships

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a full paid job where you gain experience and qualifications. Around 20% of your working hours are dedicated to studying for your qualifications which could be at college, university or with a training provider. As an employee you will receive support and hands-on experience in the role you have chosen which, with your qualifications, equip you with the right skills and knowledge for your chosen career.

You can start an apprenticeship at any level, but some many have certain entry requirements. This can include specific qualifications, including English and Maths GCSE, but some employers may provide you with extra training on the job to help you get these qualifications.

The Liverpool City Region has tons of apprenticeship opportunities for you to choose from, across many sectors and many types of roles. The Be More website puts all of these local apprenticeship opportunities in one place for you!

Pathways

Why think about pathways now?

When planning your pathway to your future career it's useful to know what skills and experience they want and where to get them. This could influence your future decisions, such as qualification or work experience choices. Here's an example on how a little research goes a long way in making your big decisions:

My dream job requires a degree in Biology - I can do that at university.

To study Biology at my favourite university I need three B grades at A Level – including Biology and another science. I also need a 4 in English and Maths at GCSE.

To study two sciences at A Level in the college I like I need all 6s in my GCSE Sciences, Maths and a 5 in my GCSE science.
